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CAPITAL PROJECT UPDATE

Wow, what a busy summer! Construction on the first phase of the capital project started in early July and will continue through October. Workers were busy throughout all areas of the District. At the end of this phase, the following will be completed:

- 40,000 square feet of roof resurfaced;
- 189 windows removed and replaced (including asbestos abatement of existing chalking);
- Approximately 5,000 bricks on the exterior of the building replaced and/or repointed;
- Five sets of exterior doors replaced and wired for a new building access system;
- Installation of a new 150 square foot walk-in cooler in the cafeteria;
- Replacement of the bus lift at the bus garage; and
- Replacement of two basketball hoops in the gymnasium.

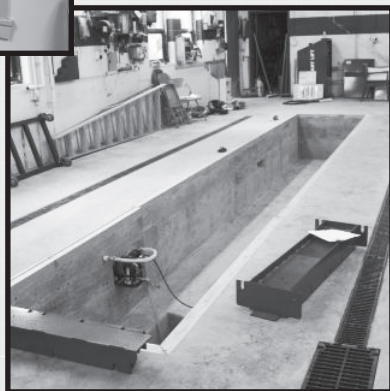
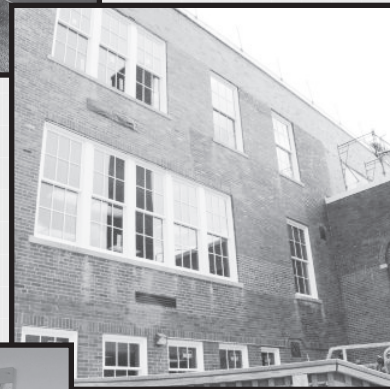
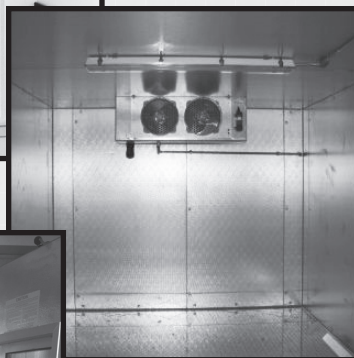
CAPITAL PROJECT UPDATE, CONTINUED

Phase two will start in the summer of 2019 and will consist of renovations to the locker rooms, restrooms and security upgrades to the front entryway. We will also begin the process of removing and replacing asbestos floor tile located throughout the building.

REGENTS EXAM RESULTS

- 100% passing rate on Earth Science and #1 in DCMO BOCES
- 100% passing rate on U.S. History and #1 in DCMO BOCES
- 92% passing rate on CC Algebra and #2 in DCMO BOCES
- 89% passing rate on CC Algebra II
- 100% passing rate on CC ELA and tied for #1 in DCMO BOCES
- 100% passing rate on Chemistry and #1 in DCMO BOCES

We see these scores as a culmination of the hard work and dedication of our PK-12 faculty and staff. Each grade level builds upon the progress made during the previous year to put our students in the best possible positions to be successful.

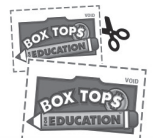

FREE AND REDUCED BREAKFAST AND LUNCH PROGRAM

The free and reduced breakfast and lunch program is a federally subsidized program developed to assist families with purchasing school breakfast and lunch. The programs provide free or reduced (\$0.25 per meal) breakfast and lunches to students whose family incomes are below certain thresholds. The savings to a family with two children enrolled in school could be as much as \$35 to \$40 per week.

Unfortunately, not all eligible families apply for the program. The reason most often cited for not applying for the program is fear that information will not be kept confidential. At Franklin Central School, all applications are kept confidential and only one person in the District sees the information; it is not shared with anyone for any reason.

In addition to benefiting the family, higher percentages of students enrolled in the free and reduced program also benefits the school. Schools that have a higher percentage of students enrolled in the program receive a higher reimbursement for the program. Further, free and reduced lunch information factors into state aid and Federal Grants—the higher the free and reduced lunch percentage the more money the school is eligible for.

To qualify for the reduced breakfast and lunch program a family of two can have an annual income of \$30,451; a family of three \$38,443; a family of four \$46,435; and a family of five \$54,427. Each additional family member increases the threshold by an additional \$7,992.

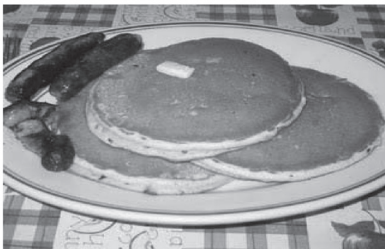

FITNESS RESULTS FOR 4TH THROUGH 7TH GRADE

Physical Fitness test results for FCS students in grades 4-7 during the 2017-18 school year show improvement across the board. Students in those grades were tested early in the school year and then again in late April, early May. Students are tested in 5 areas: Abdominal strength; Flexibility; Agility; Upper-body strength; and Cardio-Vascular Endurance.

IMPROVEMENT PERCENTAGES

- Abdominal Strength..... 86%
- Flexibility 64%
- Agility 66%
- Upper-body Strength..... 81%
- Cardiovascular Endurance 53%

These results help show which areas of physical fitness our students excelled in and which areas will still need more improvement. Based on last year's results a major emphasis will be placed on the cardiovascular endurance which is assessed by the mile run.

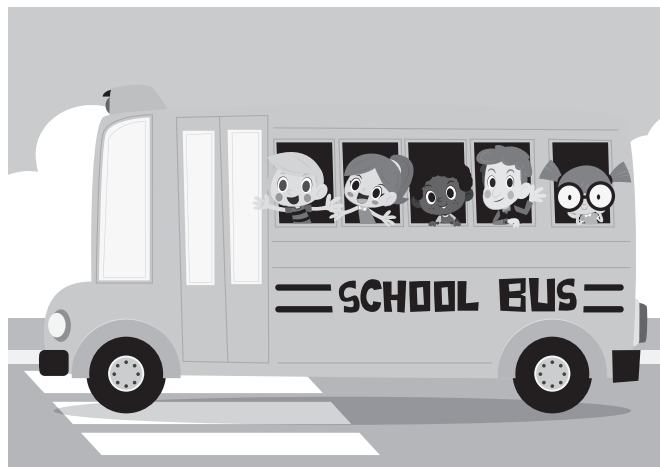

TIPS FOR RIDING THE SCHOOL BUS

- Have papers stored in a backpack or book bag so the papers cannot fly around the bus or cause a hazard on the floor. Keep belongings out of the aisle.
- Check clothing to avoid long drawstrings or other dangling items that could be a safety hazard if caught in bus doors or snagged.
- Arrive at the bus stop at least five minutes before the bus is scheduled to arrive each day. Children should be waiting for the bus as the bus can't wait for them. This helps assure orderly boarding and an on-time schedule.
- Children should board the bus in single file and away from the roadway. Behavior problems at the bus stop can create a hazardous situation for all students, so please remind children to be respectful and orderly when boarding the bus.
- Children must wait for the driver's hand signal to cross the road before boarding the bus.
- Children should sit quietly in their assigned seats. Distractions on the bus could cause an accident.
- Cameras are used on buses to ensure the safety of the children and the driver.
- Parents or guardians must submit a new dismissal form for any permanent changes to a student's dismissal to the Nurse's Office. We will accept changes to a student's daily routine. Remember the child must bring a note to school in the morning signed by the parent or guardian. All transportation changes must be made by 1:00 p.m. If you miss the 1:00 p.m. deadline, your child will need to be picked up at their designated bus stop for that particular day.

Riding a bus is a privilege that can be revoked because of misconduct. Parents/guardians may be held responsible for restitution for school property willfully damaged by their child. If you have any questions or problems, please call the Transportation Supervisor at 607-829-3366.

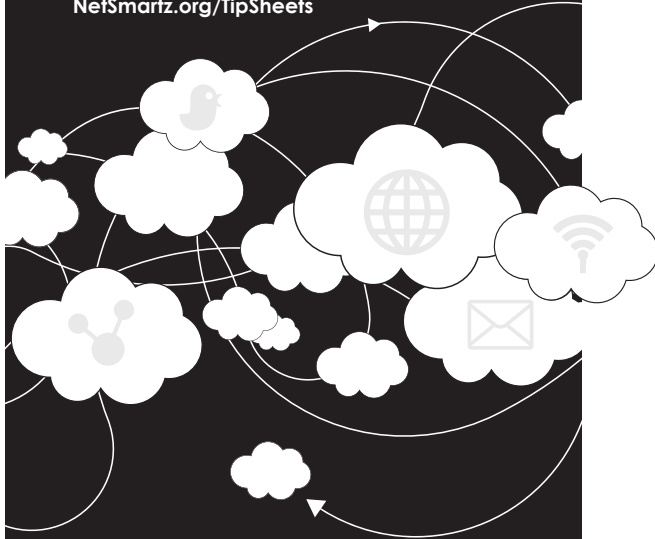
BAND NEWS

Protecting your **KIDS** on social media

Online social media services aren't new, but many of us are still learning how to use them without getting into trouble – especially children and teens. Use these tips to help your kids safely use any social media service from networking to image posting sites.

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Do you know...



What they're posting?

Check comments and images for personal information, like phone numbers and addresses, as well as inappropriate and illegal content such as hateful or threatening speech and nudity. Delete anything you think is too much information.



How they access social media?

Mobile devices, like cell phones and tablets, let children access social media apps away from adult supervision. Children may post content and even share their locations. Review app settings to help them keep information – like their location – private.



Who they're talking to?

Your child's online contact lists and followers may include people you don't know, or even people your child only knows online. Even if you don't know the contact, make sure you know what images, messages, and other content they're sharing.



What account settings they're using?

This is where you can control who has access to your child's information. Each social media service has a different setup, so take a look at each one your child uses. Always ask yourself – *what is on the profile and who can see it?*



Who has access to their information?

Most social media services have ads and applications from 3rd parties, like games and fan pages. If children click on these or add them to their profiles, they are allowing access to their personal information. Have a discussion about what's OK to add and what's not.



Where to report?

If anyone talks to your child about sex, shares or asks them to share sexual images, or is a victim of sexual exploitation, make a report to the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children® at www.CyberTipline.com or 1-800-THE-LOST®.

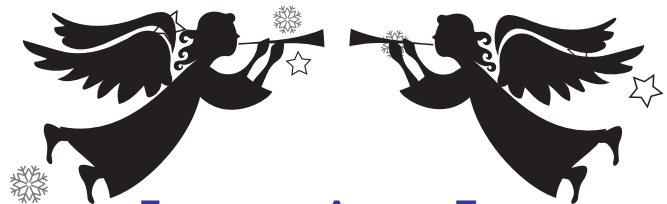
